

## Care & Maintenance Sheet 3

### Armourcoat Decorative Coatings

#### 1 Cleaning Surface Dirt and Grime

Add a small quantity of liquid detergent or soap to a bucket of warm water and clean the surface with a soft cloth. After cleaning, rinse the surface with clean water. Rinsing is best done using a garden mist sprayer (for small areas) or a low-pressure water hose (for larger areas). Where possible blot the wall dry with an absorbent towel or sponge.

Rinsing and drying the wall is an important part of the process, otherwise the solution of dirt and detergent will just dry back onto the wall.

**Never use any acid based bleaches or strongly coloured cleaning compounds.** Armourcoat decorative coatings will be unaffected by mild detergents but may soften slightly with prolonged cleaning.

Aggressive cleaning can affect the surface of the product.

#### 2 Damage and Repairs

Armourcoat decorative coatings are tough and durable coatings, but can be damaged. In the event of damage please contact the installer or contact Armourcoat directly for technical assistance, instructions and patching material. To obtain repair material, you will need to quote the colour reference of the finish.
